Product overview Military table (1923)

Rietveld was commissioned by P. van der Pluym, owner of Wessels shop, to make furniture for the Katholiek Militair Tehuis (Catholic Serviceman's Home) in Utrecht in 1923. For this furniture, the stretchers and legs are attached using halving joints that are strengthened with sturdy nuts and bolts. The top does not rest directly on the longitudinal stretchers but on a number of narrow cross pieces to create a light, spacious construction. Rietveld experimented with this technique as early as 1918 when he made a table for B. de Ligt.

Design:

Military table:

The stretchers and legs of the table are attached using halving joints that are strengthened with sturdy nuts and bolts. The top does not rest directly on the longitudinal stretchers but on a number of narrow cross pieces to create a light, spacious construction.

Military chair:

The chair has the same construction as the table. The low back is attached to the bevelled back frame with the same nuts and bolts. The chair is available in the colours black and red, and black and white.

Military stool:

The military stool is based on the model of the military chair and has the same construction. The stool is available in the colours black and red, and black and white.

For these pieces of furniture a high-quality oak is used.

Each chair is supplied with a chip, a number and a matching certificate.
